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

culture in nancy

The former city of the Dukes of Lorraine, Nancy is located at the crossroads of Europe. For centuries it was a center for artists and architects. Their unique contributions give the city a distinctive flair.

squares and sights

The city is particularly famous for its squares and historic manuments:

La Place Stanislas: this internationally renowned square was built by Stanislas Leszczynski, one of the Dukes of Lorraine. It is famous for its beautiful gilded ironwork designed by Jean Lamour. On Stanislas Square, you will discover the Hotel de Ville, the Opera Theatre of Lorraine and Fine Arts Museum.

La Place Carrière: it stretches from the Héré Gate to the exquisite Government Palace

Le Palais Ducal: the palace is located within the confines of the medieval city or old town

La Porte de la Craffe: at one end of the Grande Rue in the old town, this imposing fortress once protected the city

Religious monuments: Nancy has 6 famous churches: Basilique Saint-Epvre, Eglise des Cordeliers, Cathédrale Notre-Damede-l'Annonciation de Nancy, Eglise Notre Dame de Bonsecours, Eglise Saint Pierre, and Eglise Saint Sébastien.





parks and gardens

Nancy owns wonderful public parks for everyone to enjoy. The most famous is "la Pépinière" which offers a rose garden, a football ground, a brewery and soon a water park. Parc Sainte-Marie is close to ICN and welcomes picnics students in the spring. Do not miss the beautiful Jardin Ephémère on Place Stanislas.

MUSEUMS

For those who appreciate art and art history, Nancy has 3 museums, each dedicated to a different aspect of the city's cultural heritage. Located in different parts of the city, the museums have distinctive architectural styles:

The Museum of Lorraine is located within the Palace of the Dukes of Lorraine in the medieval city. Visitors can retrace the history of the region from prehistoric to modern times.

The Fine Arts Museum is housed in one of the splendid 18th century pavilions surrounding Stanislas Square. It contains a magnificent collection of paintings, sculptures and artwork as well as an exceptional collection of crystal by Daum.

The Museum of l'Ecole de Nancy can be found in a late 19th century Chateau. It is dedicated to "Art Nouveau", the decorative style of art which flourished in Nancy at the turn of the 20th century.

For those of you who love nature or for those who are interested in the mining and steel industries (which were the traditional industries of Nancy), the following museums will certainly interest you:

The Museum aquarium of Nancy has more than 10,000 specimens, some of which represent endangered species. In addition to tropical fish and marine animals, the aquarium contains a natural history museum.

Iron Museum has exhibits on the history of iron and ironwork as well as techniques for making iron.

Theatres, concerts, cinemas

Compose your own programs as there is a vast range to choose from: Opéra national de Lorraine, Centre Dramatique National, CCN Ballet de Lorraine, Zénith de Nancy, L'Autre Canal, etc. Nancy owns many cultural locations.

Metz, the capital of Lorraine and a city of international trade fairs, is ideally situated at the crossroads of Luxembourg, Germany and Belgium. This regional metropolis offers residents an enviable quality of life just a stone's throw from the Vosqes mountains and Alsace.

Metz is a key communications hub and has the characteristics of three European construction pioneers, Germany, Belgium and the Duchy of Luxembourg. It has therefore played a key role in shaping major European cultural trends.

"In Metz, the information highways connect people". Metz made communication its speciality in 1984 when it established a Technopôle, Europe's first technology hub, specializing in software and communication.

Metz undoubtedly benefits from its superb location, with various French and international companies moving to the region, not to mention a number of elite business schools including Centrale/Supélec, Georgia Tech, Arts et Métiers ParisTech, and others.

Nature is present in Metz to the heart of the city: with more than 1161 ac. of green space, Metz is among the first green cities in France. The green spaces are one of the jewels of the city, placing it at the top of the ranking of French flower cities. Metz is laureate of the European prize for flowering.

A city of culture

From the Colline Sainte-Croix to the Amphitheatre quarter, through the lles and the Citadelle, the city of Metz is steeped in history, with its neighbourhoods boasting a variety of architectural styles. What an atmosphere... From music to entertainment, Metz has to offer to everyone. Entertainment venues and museums include the Arsenal, Opéra-Théâtre, Les Trinitaires, Arènes de Metz, the Palace, Klub and Kinépolis cinemas, the Galaxie, and the Musée de la Cour d'Or. And don't miss a key event in the city's calendar: Les 'Nuits Blanches' [White nights].

an attractive historic centre

Nürnberg is a fortified city with many kilometers of beautiful ramparts.

Beyond its village dedicated to artIsanat and mainly wooden toys and glass painting, Nürnberg has a historic center consisting of beautiful buildings and an attractive shopping center. Highly touristy city, it has a high number of pubs, breweries and restaurants.

A CUltural city life between tradition and modernity

The museums of Nürnberg highlight the history of the city through original staging and plays that show the life and work of Dürer or even the daily life of a patrician family.

Museums and other cultural institutions participate each year in May in the "Blue Night" (Blaue Nacht), the long night of museums and culture of Nürnberg.

And when Nürnberg is transformed into "the first Christmas city in Germany", it is to highlight one of these renowned culinary treasures beyond the borders: the gingerbread!

personal data are secured because they are never stored on your telephone or on your card. All online transactions must be authorized with a password.

Is this your first time enrolling in a higher education institution?

For health care cost reimbursements, your mandatory health insurance scheme will not change. You will remain an independent insured member of your current social protection scheme, which is typically the same as that of your parents or legal guardians, no matter which scheme this is (general, agricultural, or other).

There are no specific steps to carry out in relation to this membership, but you should still take the time to create an account on ameli.fr (general scheme), MSA (agricultural scheme) or any other website for a specific scheme to ensure that you are reimbursed for future

Were you a student in France last year?

Whether you are French or an international student, there are no specific steps to complete. You will remain a member of your current social security scheme.



Starting from the 2019-2020 academic year, you must obtain a certificate confirming that you have settled/paid your Student and Campus Life Contribution (Contribution Vie Etudiante et de Campus – CVEC).

The CVEC is intended to improve student services and support in the areas of social life, health, culture, and sport.

Depending on your circumstances, you may or may not be required to pay the €91 fee, which is collected by the CROUS (Regional Centres for Student Services).

Students taking a double degree at two institutions need only pay the fee once.

MUTUAL insurance and health care assistance

It is also very important to understand your supplementary health care cover. Social Security reimburses 65% of health care costs, and a mutual supplementary insurer can cover the remaining 35% of costs.

This 35% figure can quickly amount to very big sums of money depending on the type of treatment provided (laboratory analysis, consultations with specialists, X-rays, hospitalization, etc.).

We therefore suggest that you find out how much cover your mutual insurer (parental, student, supplementary CMU, etc.) will provide.
