What to expect in PGE3/MSc2?

Complete your PGE course

- Core courses
- specialisation / MSc courses
- Specific required experiences: three PGE quitus

Prepare for transition to employment

• Apply for internship, apprenticeship, or other type of contract

Complete your professional & personal project.

BLENDED LEARNING (Teaching methods)

- On-campus classes (IC/PR):
 - Classical synchronous in-class course sessions
- Digital Learning Resources (DR/MN) not planned:
 - Asynchronous, at home
 - Based on resources provided by your instructor (videos, digital material, readings, ...)
- **Project** (30-hrs modules only):
 - In class, or via videolink
 - Group work on the project linked to the course
- Additionnal personal work not planned:
 - To be achieved in addition to the above
 - For prerequisite & further readings, exercises, projects, ...

ECTS CREDITS

PGE = Master in Management :

- In two years: <u>120 ECTS</u> (PGE 2,3 M1-M2), or
- In three years: <u>180 ECTS</u> (PGE 1,2,3 L3-M1-M2).
- 1 year = 60 ECTS (credits) = 2 independent semesters of 30 credits each
- 1 semester = a set of modules ("courses")
- 1 ECTS = 30 hrs of student learning, <u>all included</u> (sessions, personal work, assignments, readings, digital learning, examinations, etc.)

Example:

- 4-ECTS module = 120 hrs of student learning (4 ECTS * 30 hrs), including class contact & digital learning (30 hrs).
- Expect 120 hrs 30 hrs = 90 hrs of personal work.

MODULE DESCRIPTORS The syllabus

For each module, your instructor submits a <u>syllabus</u>, which provides a global course description:

- **Module description:** the general content of the module.
- Intended Learning Outcomes (ILOs): expected knowledge & skills.
- Descriptors: how the module relates to the mission related strands Sustainability, #ATM, international issues, and SDGs.
- **Module outline:** a brief description of sessions.
- Teaching: teaching and learning methods adopted.
- Course material and readings: references and useful resources.
- Research connection: how this module is linked to ICN faculty research activities and emerging trends in management research.
- Assessment: components, types, methods, weighting, and how each component relates to ILOs.
- Programme learning objectives: contribution to the PGE learning objectives (LOs).

MASTER THESIS A significant piece of work, clear guidelines & procedures

Characteristics

- To be done preferably within your specialisation, and to consider as a <u>valuable piece of work (contribution to the field of study)</u>
- Scientific approach, with sound academic references
- With a real managerial issue
- Progression
 - Follow <u>strictly</u> every mandatory milestone (deliverables L1, L2, L3, and L4)
 - Follow your thesis supervisor instructions
 - ... to complete your work by the end of June

MASTER THESIS How to graduate in July

Work is sequenced throughout four deliverables

- You must manage your time with great care
- Do your best to deliver, on time, each deliverable.
- Target the 1st session of graduation (July): *it's possible* (80% success)

Do not first consider the 2nd session as an alternative

- Not completing and submitting deliverables will lead you to failure
- It is not possible to produce a master thesis in a few weeks during the summer
- Do not expect assistance from your thesis supervisor during the summer break
- In case of 2nd session failure: <u>re-take is deferred to the next academic year</u> (tuition fees will apply).



PGE'S THREE QUITUS

A quitus states that a mandatory activity has been realized

All quitus must be validated by the end of M2

- English proficiency: you are proficient in business English
- International experience: part of your experience has been done abroad
- Professional experience: you are ready to join a company



QUITUS VALIDATION Recommendation

Too often, quitus validation is a problem at the end of PGE!

- Evaluate your situation today!
- When do you satisfy to all required quitus?
- How?
- What time do you have to get prepared, apply, etc.
- Any alternate plan, just in case...?
- **Fixeptions are rarely granted by the Programme Board. DO NOT COUNT ON THEM!**

QUITUS & APPRENTICESHIP Specificities

750 TOEIC *or* 78 TOEFL *or* 550 GMAT

- LV1/ English Quitus: same rules for all PGE students (TOEIC/TOEFL/GMAT)
- Professionnal Quitus: your apprenticepship M1+M2 should provide the minimum number of months required (9 months <u>in the company</u> – periods at school do not count).
 - <u>Validation</u> is achieved through regular deliverables, and your *livret d'apprentissage:*
 - A link between you, the company, and ICN
 - Fed by your workplace tutor (*maître d'apprentissage*), and your faculty tutor.
- International Quitus: exempted provided your contract ends at the expected date.

<u>Advice</u>: if possible, spend your S6 in a subsidiary abroad An international experience is always valued and valuable in a resume.
